SWIMMING LESSONS PP TO YEAR 6 AND ESC

In-Term swimming lessons for the ESC Classes and PP – Yr 6 students will take place next term, beginning Monday 26th October and concluding Friday 6th November (Weeks 3 & 4). There will be a total of 10 lessons at the Balga Pool.

The price is \$55 per child. The payment covers the cost of bus hire and pool entry. Please note that this is lower than the estimated cost scheduled at the beginning of the year.

Payment may be made in a lump sum or in instalments by arrangement with the Registrar.

It is essential that the Enrolment and Consent Form, that has been handed out this week, is returned before the lessons commence so we are able to organise the correct number of swimming teachers.

Each child must have their own enrolment form/consent form to be handed to their own classroom teacher, regardless as to whom the payment is made.

Full payment must be finalised before swimming lessons commence.
