What a great start to Term 3 we have had! At the end of last term we found out that our Year 6 students who entered Cluedunnit (a competition organised by the WA Law Society) finished in the top 10 of the state, with the manager of the competition letting us know how impressed he was with the high standard of the work our students submitted.

The classes all participated in activities, followed by a kangaroo sausage sizzle and lemon myrtle cake for all. In the afternoon we were treated to some great singing by the Aboriginal band *Out and About*. Everyone got up and had a dance.



On the 30 July, we celebrated the completion of two projects within our school. The first was the City of Wanneroo (COW) leadership project by Year 6 students with a new Community Garden near the Child and Parent Centre (CPC). The second project was the creation of three multicultural and inclusive murals with Artist in Residence, Paul DeeJ. Our local member of parliament for Mirrabooka, Meredith Hammat MLA also attended and celebrated with parents, students and supporters of the projects.



Swimming is well underway at Balga Leisure Centre, with our students developing vital swimming and water safety skills.

We have many school events coming up, including STEM week, Book Week and the Faction Carnivals. We look forward to seeing our families supporting the participation of students into the range of activities planned for this term.

This sports themed mural represents the Roseworth factions and games that students enjoying playing at recess and lunchtime. It is located near the basketball courts and at the end of W6&W7.




This mural is located near the junior primary playground in East Block. Students gave Paul ideas about the types of games they like to play at school like skipping, hide and seek and sandpit play.

- Once you have your Passport and have completed one of the listed activities, request a green slip from the teacher or nominated person. Drop your green slip into the front office.



City of Wanneroo Leadership Project

The Happy Kids have been involved in a Leadership Project during Semester 1. This was organised by the City of Wanneroo and ten of our senior students have been involved in this project. Initially, the students attended a Leadership Workshop at the City of Wanneroo early in the year. The group chose to work on a Community Safety Project whereby they planned to make the entrance near our Dental Clinic and Child & Parent Centre more welcoming for our families and families that visit to access health services in this area of the school grounds. A lot of careful consultation and planning took place and we finally decided on making some art work for display in this area and developing a Community Garden to be used by our families and visitors. The students developed some art work based on recycled bike wheels and created some dental health related signage. Ms Brockman and the group worked carefully to recycle some old garden beds, clean them, paint them and use them for the basis of the community garden. We contacted Bunnings for support and they supplied some plants and some soil. The students organised a fundraising activity, a Free Dress Day, to raise money to purchase additional plants, two benches and a storage box for the area. A morning of planting was undertaken and we have thriving garden area, which will be ready for families to access in the coming months. The Community Garden was officially opened on Friday 30th July by a representative from the City of Wanneroo. Our families are welcome to pick produce from the garden when it is ready to be harvested.



West Block
