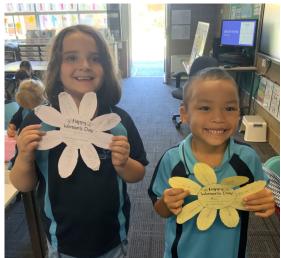


**E5**

E3 have been busy getting our hands mucky learning all about Damper! Mrs Foley has been sharing with us how Aboriginal people were the first in history to make bread using seeds collected from Acacia trees and water from the rivers and lakes. We compared the ingredients and technologies that were used to make Damper in Traditional times with how we make damper Today. It was a very tasty lesson!













My name is Mrs Jessica Jefferies and I am the new Music teacher.

I started the year by cleaning and setting up the music room to make it an enjoyable and usable space that was welcoming to the children.

I began our first lessons together by getting the children to listen and imagine.

To coincide to with the Winter Olympics, we explored the music of the Olympic Games, in particular music written for them by the famous composer John Williams (of Harry Potter, Jaws and Star Wars fame)

We then began to explore cultural music and instruments related to Chinese New Year. We extended this to look at two of the families within music- strings and percussion.

In the older years, we have been looking at how music is put together- the structure. We are now beginning, in small groups, to



write, read, perform and assess music that we created. We have used a poem as our staring point. We are using both tuned and untuned instruments and are using graphic notation to scribe our music.

In the younger years, we are also learning about the structure of music. We are doing this by singing songs, performing action dances, looking at beat and learning about some of the terminology associated with music.

We have also been learning a school community song for Harmony Week, which W1 and 2 have recorded and will be sent home via Seesaw.

I am looking forward to doing some songs about Easter as that season approaches.



In Art, W2 & W3 have completed various ship projects to link to their HASS topic of explorers.





In Mathematics we are working on our problem solving and using the problem-solving framework to solve open-ended questions. Students recently worked in groups of 6 to solve the question "How many Stepping Stones books are needed to cover three desks?"

Each group chose a different strategy to solve the problem. We discovered that there were many ways to approach the question and each group came up with their own answer and gave reasons why theirs was correct.

On Tuesday E4 made Damper with Ms Foley in the wet area.

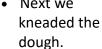
First we mixed the flour and water in a
