Dear Families,




# SCIENCE

Term 3 means we are heading into Biological Science. This is the study of living things, plants and animals. Each class has a small greenhouse vegetable patch where they are competing to see which class can grow the best fruit and vegetables.

In the STEM Hub we are lucky enough to have two lifecycles in progress.



\*Gamora, our stick insect, lays eggs all the time. These will hatch and a small stick insect will emerge. The small stick insects will grow to adult full-size insects, and

they will lay eggs. This is the stick insect's life cycle.



\*Our butterfly also lays eggs but goes through a very different process. From the egg a caterpillar emerges, they then eat and get bigger. They will then form a chrysalis around them and change into a butterfly. This is called metamorphosis.


# Kindy



# E3
