Parking

Gates

The gates open at 8.30am each morning. Any arrivals after 9.00am are to go to the office for a late/welcome note. Please do not send students to school earlier than 8.30am as they are not supervised.

There is no playing on playgrounds before and after school (staff are not supervising students at these times).

Gates will be locked at 9.00am in the morning and 3.15pm in the afternoon so please move out promptly.

Bikes, scooters and other modes of transport are to be locked up in bike racks near East Block (Stoke Court) and must be walked through school grounds (not ridden) for safety reasons.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

The **Roseworth Dental Therapy Centre** will be open Monday-Friday for Term 1, 2025.

To maximise the number of patients we see, students who are enrolled with the School Dental Service and are in Year 3 and above will be collected from class for their dental checkup.

Please note, we will continue to send appointments home for parents or guardians to attend with children who are being seen for their initial examination appointment with the School Dental Service, and for checkup appointments for children below Year 3.

If your child does not require further treatment we will send home a form to let you know your child has been seen and they do not require any treatment.

If children require treatment we will send home consent forms outlining the treatment required.

We will also send a medical history and Medicare form for parents or guardians to complete and return before treatment can be commenced.

Please ensure your contact details are current on the returned forms.

This process enables us to collect patients from class when we have missed or cancelled appointments. If you receive a letter for an appointment, please attend the appointment with your child. If your child has a toothache, please call the clinic.

If you would prefer to attend your child's appointment please contact the Dental Therapy Centre to advise on 9342 4657.

E3

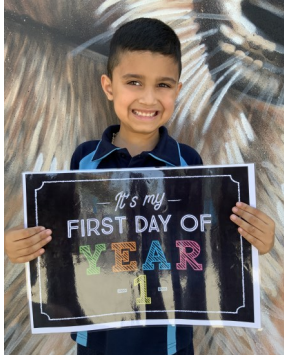
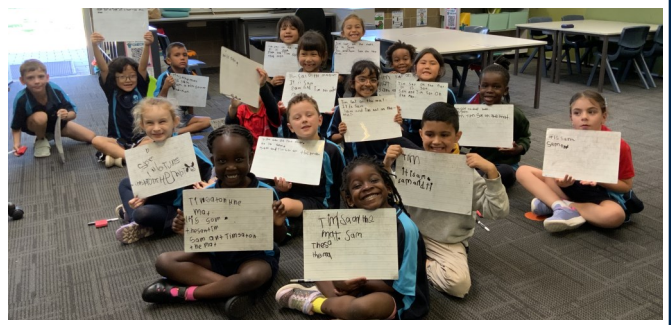
E3 have had a terrific nature inspired start to 2025!

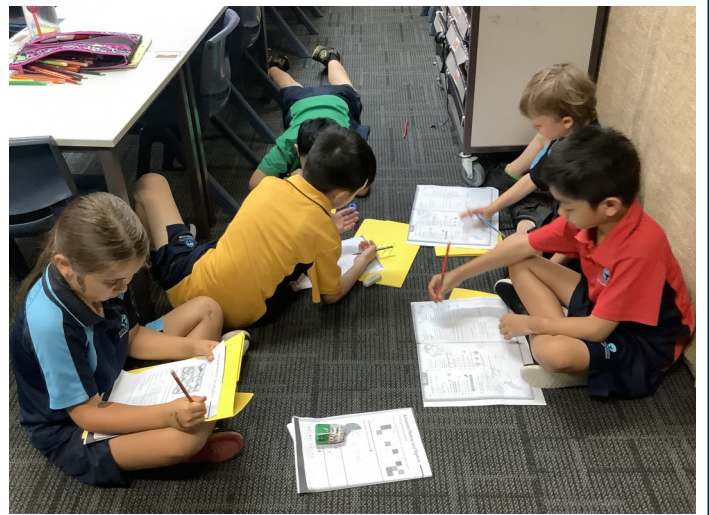
E5

On Tuesday the 18th of February, E4 and E5 went for a Walk on Country with Mrs Foley.



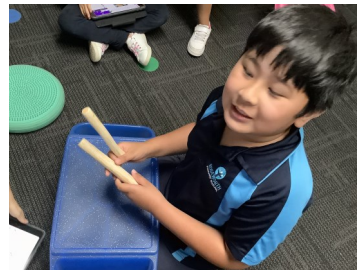
W1

W3

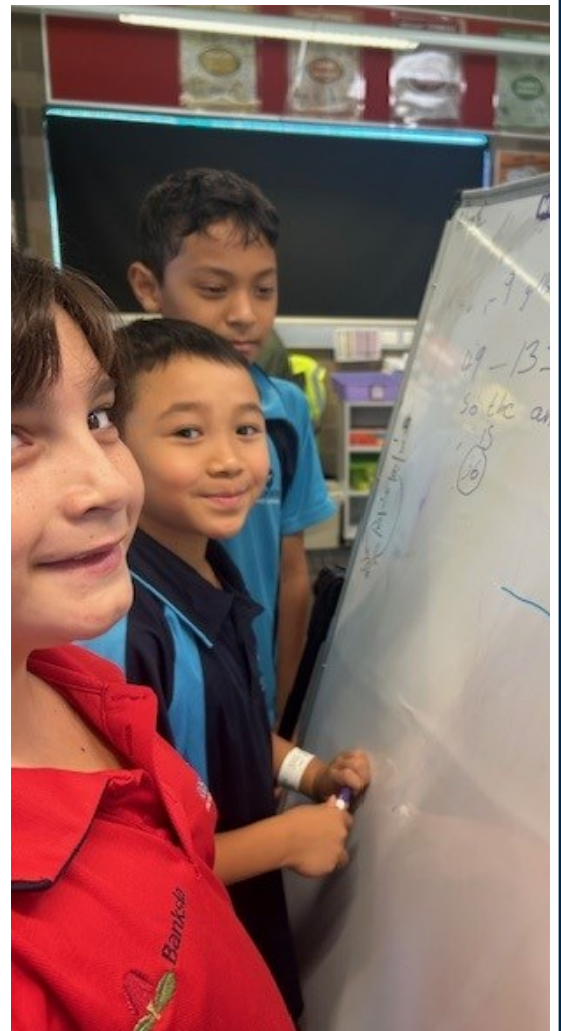
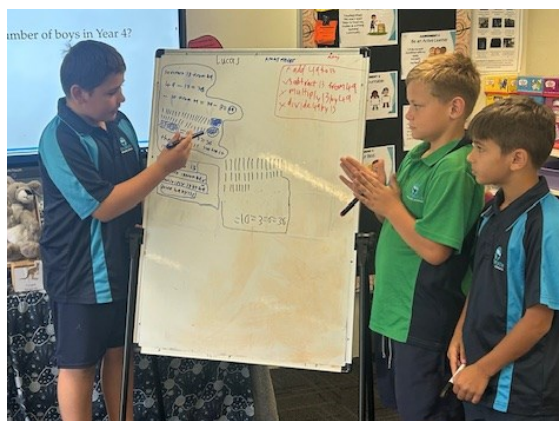

W4

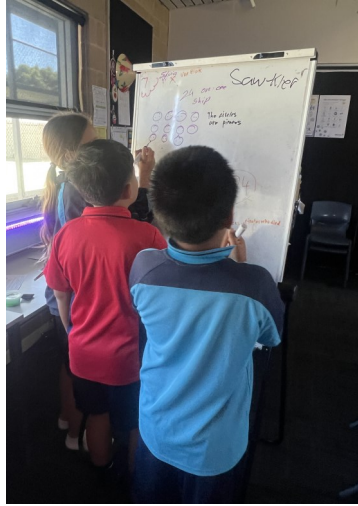

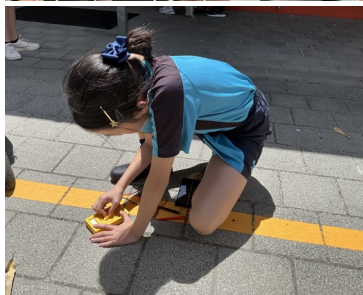

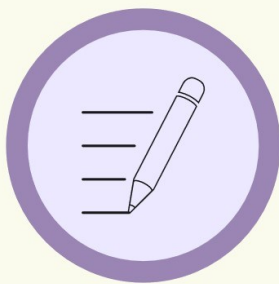
NAPLAN 2025

NAPLAN 2025 is not far away. This will be occurring from Wednesday 12th to Monday 24th March for all Year 3 and 5 students. Please see general information below. If you have any additional questions, please see your class teacher or Mrs Lee (Deputy Principal) for further information.

NAPLAN

National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy Information for parents and carers

- All students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 in Australia do NAPLAN tests in March each year.
- NAPLAN tests students' skills in reading, writing and maths.
- The test questions are presented in Standard Australian English dialect.
- Students read some of the questions and listen to others with headphones.
- The tests will get easier or harder, depending on how students are going in the test.
- Students do four different tests. The names of the four tests are:



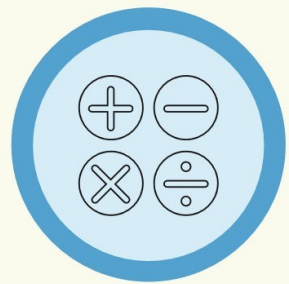
Writing



Reading



Conventions of language
(spelling, grammar and punctuation)



Numeracy

- Students in Year 3 will do the Writing test using pencil and paper. Year 3 students will answer the other test questions on the computer.
- Students in Years 5, 7 and 9 will answer all their test questions on computers.
- Teachers will help students get ready for NAPLAN tests.
- Schools will get their students' results. The school will then give parents/carers a report showing their own child's results.
- Parents/carers can talk to the teacher about these results.
- NAPLAN shows how students are going all over Australia. People who work in the Australian Government, state and territory education authorities and schools use NAPLAN results. The results let them see which schools are doing well and which schools might need help.

Talk to your teacher if you have any questions about your child doing the tests.

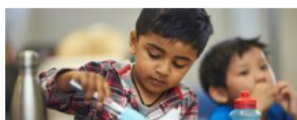

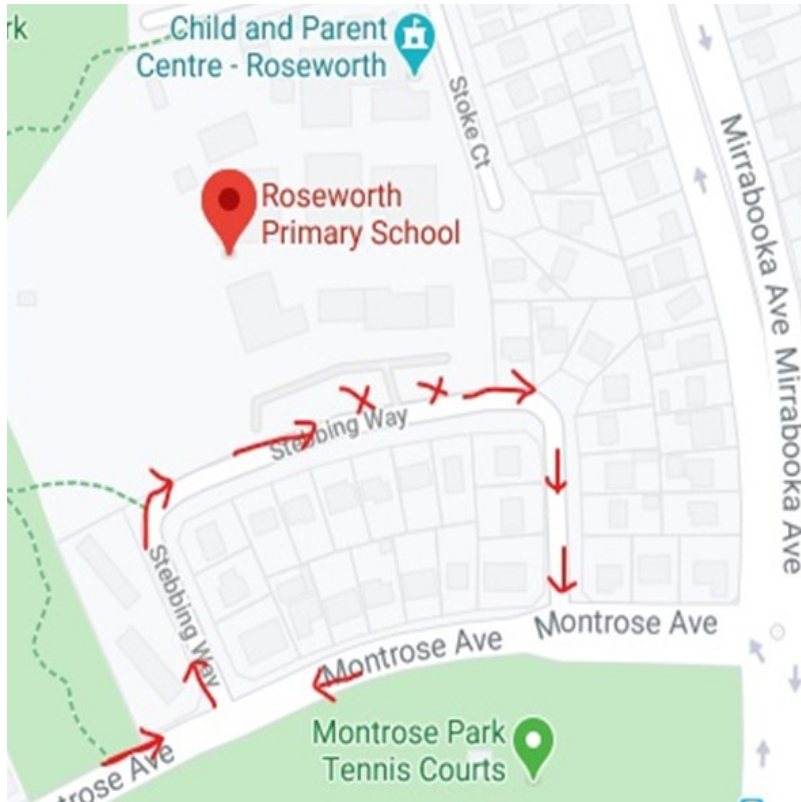
