




P2

They are everywhere!














F2

has been bird watching, where they observed birds closely and discussed their features. The class is excited to finish their reports, and we can't wait to read them at the end of the term.












E3

W1

Every Monday until the end of term, Ms Foley will be teaching our class about Noongar culture. During one of our lessons, we went for an interesting On Country walk, identifying native flora within our school bushland whilst collecting pieces to create an in class display.













W2

Over the past few weeks in Mathematics, W2 have been learning about symmetry. The students showed their expert knowledge on this topic by creating some symmetrical artwork. They made designs only on one side of the page and pressed it to create a symmetrical design.











W3

In W3, we are having another fantastic term. We have been doing lots of group work with our peers. In this process, we have been learning how we can work effectively as a team and how we can be supportive group members.

In Mathematics, we have been looking at mass. One of the group activities we did, was finding objects in the classroom, predicting its mass and then used measuring scales to find out its actual weight. We loved this activity, and found out some surprising measurements! Next up will be finding the capacity of various liquids.











W4

Every Wednesday morning during fitness, W4 has been enthusiastically working on their fundamental movement skills with Mr Harris. These sessions are packed with fun and energy as students explore a variety of

activities designed to build coordination, strength and agility. From creative animal moves like bear crawls and crab walks to practicing essential skills such as throwing and catching, the students are developing their physical abilities in engaging and playful ways. 












W6/W7

Well done to all competitors on a fantastic effort.














