## Swimming Lessons

## Transition for 2026

Transition Programs from Year 6 to High School will be commencing soon. Please ensure enrolment forms are complete so we can notify the relevant students and their families about orientation activities. The High Schools have asked us to remind parents that enrolment forms for 2026 need to be finalised by now.

### Kindergarten 2026

Kindergarten enrolments for 2026 are now being accepted. Please let people know who live in the area that have children of this age. Enrolments can be referred to the office. A Pre-Kindy program will be run by the CPC and will commence in Term 4 this year.

## New Attendance System





We had a great time at end of Term 2, discussing NAIDOC and our vision for the next generation. Students wrote what they would love to see in their future Australia.





# **W3**
