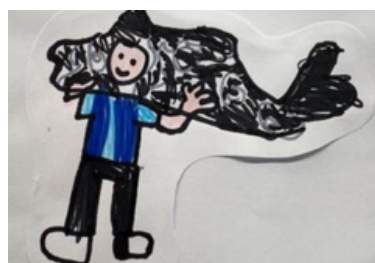
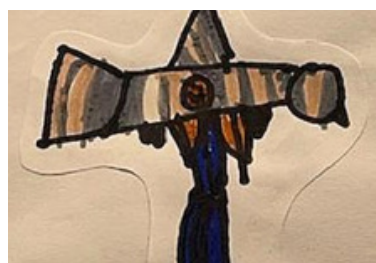
In Kindy we have been learning about Australian animals. Did you know that koala's get all their water from leaves, kangaroos use their tail to balance and that echidna babies are called puggles?

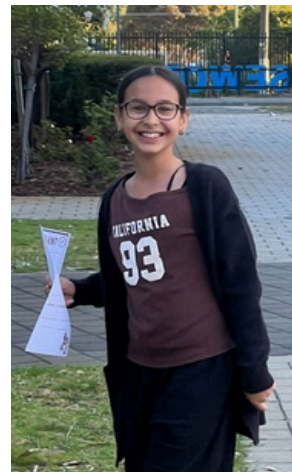
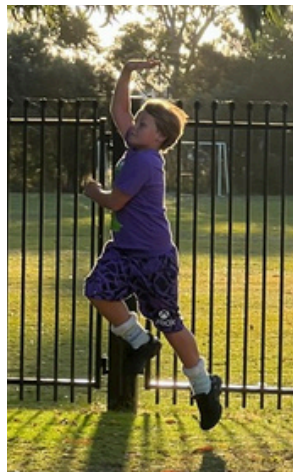
W4/W6/W7 Yr 5 Sleepover
