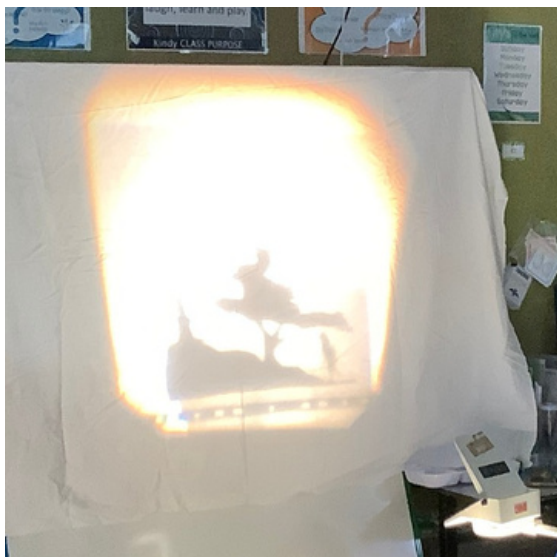

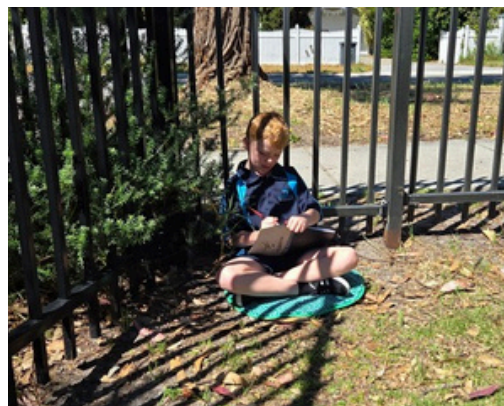
E2

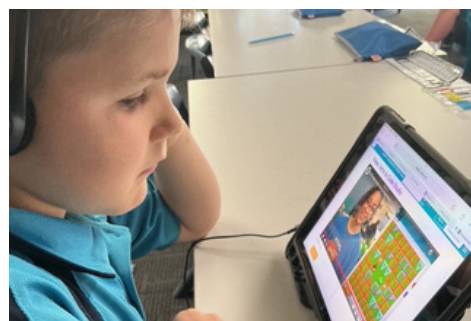
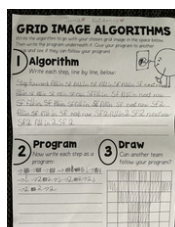
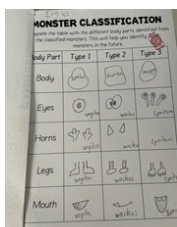
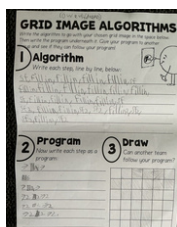
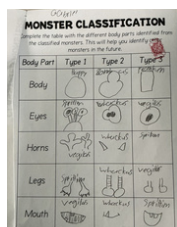


W1

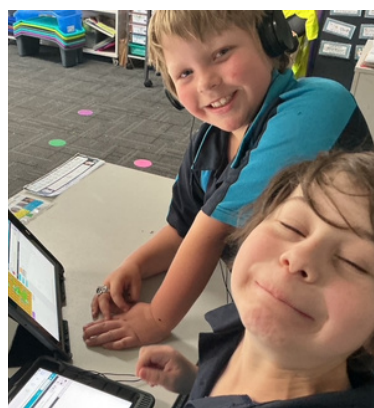

W2

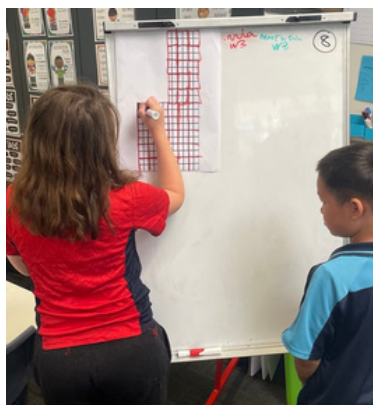
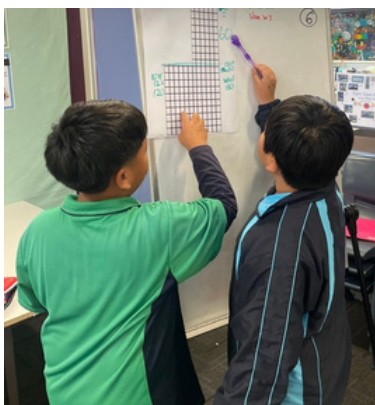
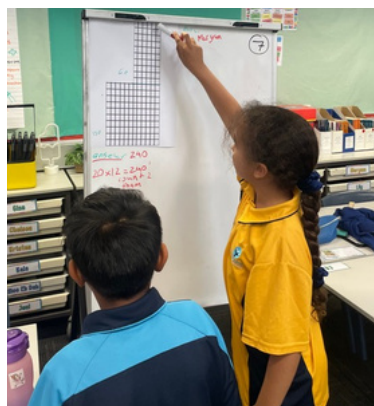

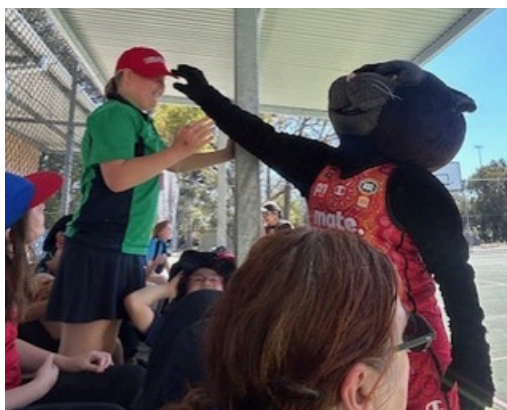
W3
