Helping Children Build Playground Skills Through Simple Games

Did you know that “old school” card and board games can help children develop important skills for the playground? Games like UNO, Donkey and Snap are favourites in the Chaplain’s office because they’re not only fun, they help kids learn and grow.

Playing these games at home is a great bonding time for families and also supports children in building skills such as:

- Boosting learning: Improving memory, problem-solving and early Maths skills.
- Building language: Practising talking, listening and learning new words.
- Growing social skills: Learning cooperation, turn-taking and patience.
- Managing emotions: Handling winning, losing and big feelings in healthy ways.
- Improving focus: Supporting attention and self-control, especially for children with ADHD.

Even a quick game of UNO (5–10 minutes!) encourages turn-taking, listening and cheering for others. It’s a simple way to help your child gain confidence and develop the skills they use every day in the playground.



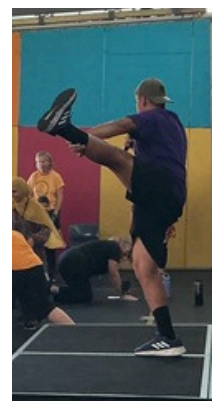
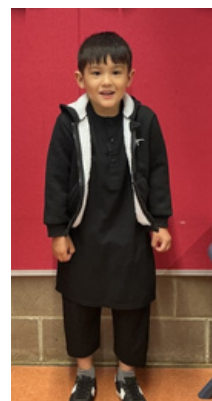

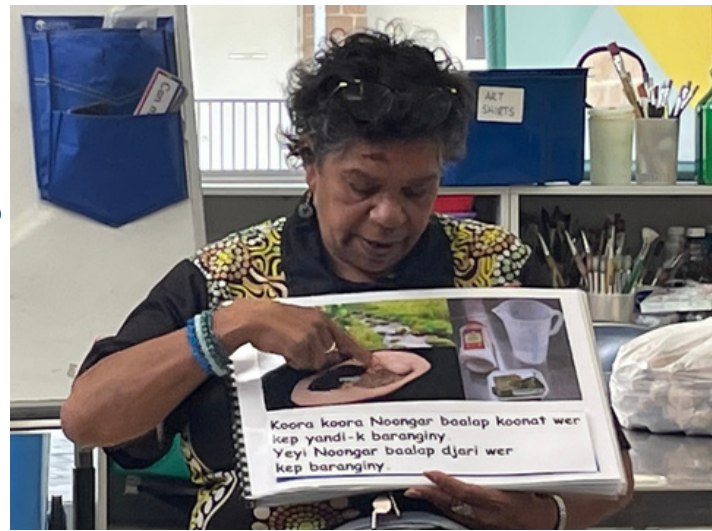
P2

We have been learning about and using lots of Maths in Pre-Primary lately. We are practising counting, sorting and measuring. Look at some of the fun activities we are doing.



E2

In HASS, we have been learning about the history of technology. In one of our lessons, Mrs Foley taught us how damper was traditionally made in Noongar culture thousands of years ago. At the end of the lesson, we got to eat the damper and it was delicious! Thank you, Mrs Foley.



E3

In E3, we have been learning about tools from the past and comparing them with tools we use today. Mrs Foley taught us how damper was made in the past using Acacia seeds, water from rivers, yandi to collect and grind the seeds, and a kaal fire to cook the dough.



E4 / E5

Students from E4 and E5 went for an On Country Walk to Montrose Park as part of our Talk for Writing Program. This experience helped us build a strong “hook” for our upcoming recount work and supported our understanding of the land around us. During the walk, Mrs Foley shared her knowledge about local plants and culture. Students discovered the “lollies” from the Banksia tree and learnt how Mar (Wind) carries the seeds from the Balga (grass tree) so new plants can grow. We also spent mindful time laying on Boodja (land) to connect with Country and appreciate the world around us. Our classes showed wonderful blue behaviours, walking safely to and from the park and demonstrating respect, curiosity and care for country!



W1

W1 students were involved in deep discussions regarding our new timetable.

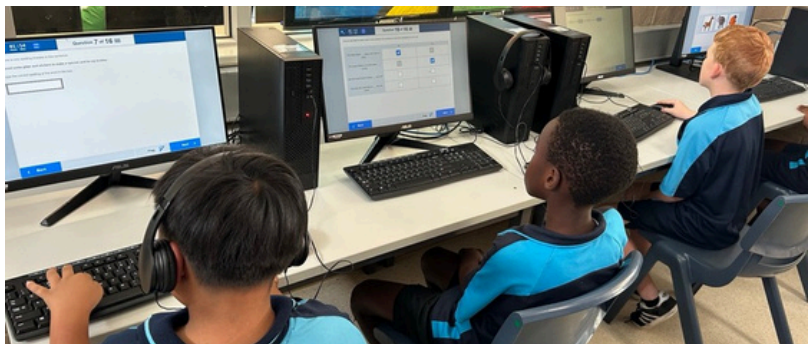
Many students enjoy the social aspect of conversing with class friends and having the time to sit and eat without the pressure of finishing their food as there are two more breaks.

W4 Balloon Rocket Progress

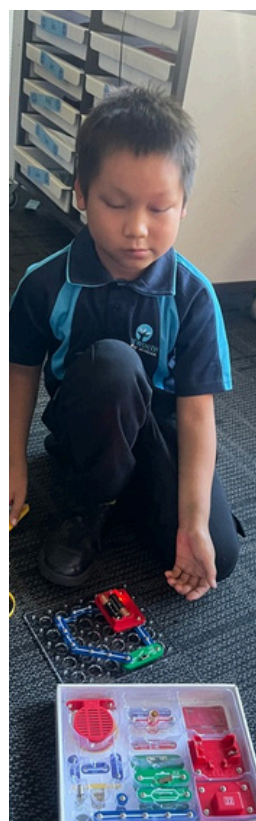
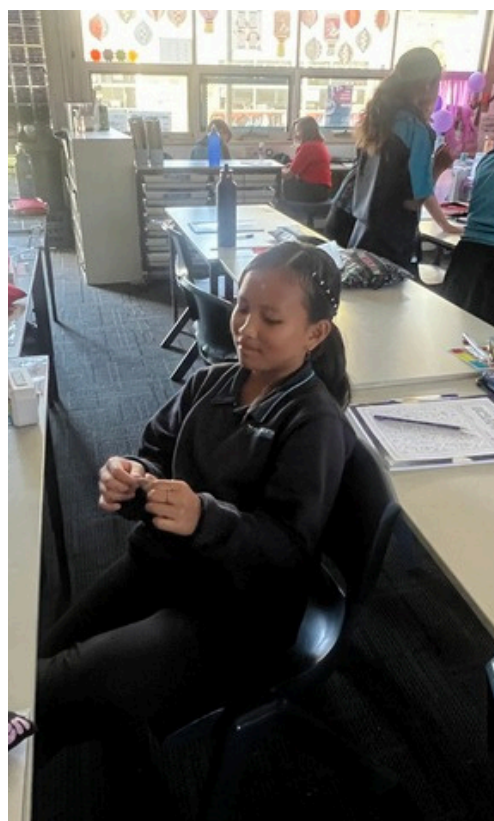

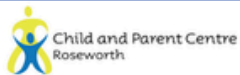
