2026 SCHOOL VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES

The Roseworth Primary School Board has endorsed the schedule of Voluntary Contributions and Charges for 2026. The schedule is broken into four sections and will allow you to calculate all costs that may be incurred throughout the school year.

1. Contributions

The total amount of voluntary contributions parents/caregivers are being asked to pay has been set at \$60 per student which is in line with the School Education Regulations 2000.

The contributions collected will be used to supplement education programs within the school. While the contributions are voluntary, the quality of our teaching and learning program are maximised when each family makes its contribution.

Your contribution will be used to supplement school funding for the purchase of resources needed in the provision of the learning program activities. The table below gives you the breakdown of where we will direct your voluntary contribution.

The School has a number of options to assist families to make their contribution.

- Option 1** A single contribution of \$60 per student.
- Option 2** Four equal contributions, each of \$15.00 per student.
- Option 3** Two equal payments, each of \$30.00 per student.

The School Board would like to emphasise that the contribution per child (\$60.00) equates to \$1.50 per week over the course of the year. All contributions are used for the direct benefit of the children. We are very grateful to everyone who supports the school in this way.



2. Charges for Extra Cost Optional Components

These are costs associated with special programs, excursions and other optional activities. A breakdown of the estimated **maximum charge** for your child's participation in activities for 2025 has been included in the schedule below.

Students can only participate in these activities if they have signed parental permission and have paid the charge associated with the activity.

Please Note: *The above calculations are a maximum guide only. Payment is needed when an incursion/excursion is organised and your child brings home a note setting out the activity and cost.*

3. Personal Items List

This list covers items of a personal nature and has been previously distributed. The charge for the Personal Items List will vary from student to student depending on which year they are enrolled in. The maximum charge for 2026 does not exceed \$95.00. Parents may purchase these items from their chosen retailer, or use the nominated school supplier, Champion. It is also important to note that students may need to top-up items over the year.

4. PEAC (Primary Extension and Challenge) / EYES (Early Years Extension)

PEAC is a part-time program for public school children in years 1 to 6. Children are tested in Year 4 and selected students to participate in a range of innovative and challenging programs offered in a variety of ways. Children who attend are withdrawn from regular class to attend PEAC programs.

5. Other Fundraising Costs – P&C Association

In 2026 the P & C will continue to fulfil its function of representing parent views on issues affecting the educational experience of our children, running the school canteen and supporting school programs. The P & C will be running various fundraising initiatives over the year. Monies collected from these will be spent on items which the school community believes to be of priority in enhancing our children's lives and opportunities at school. During previous years, donations have supported playground equipment and the overall school grounds to enrich outdoor learning.
