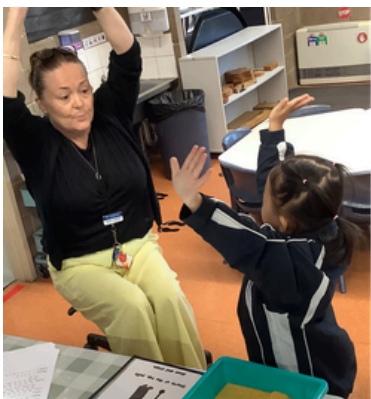

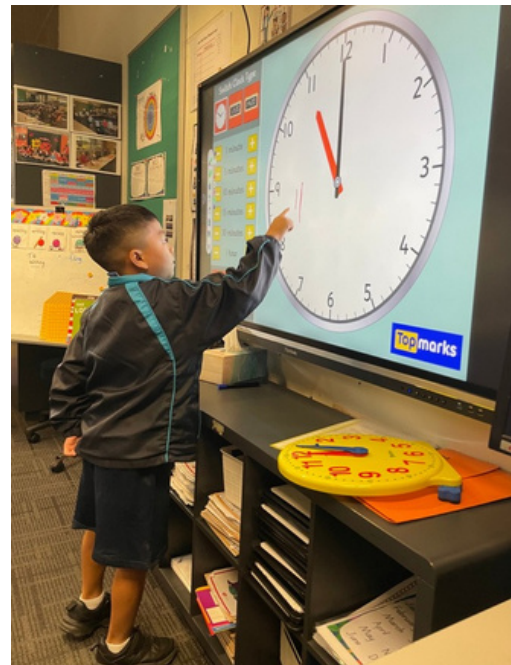
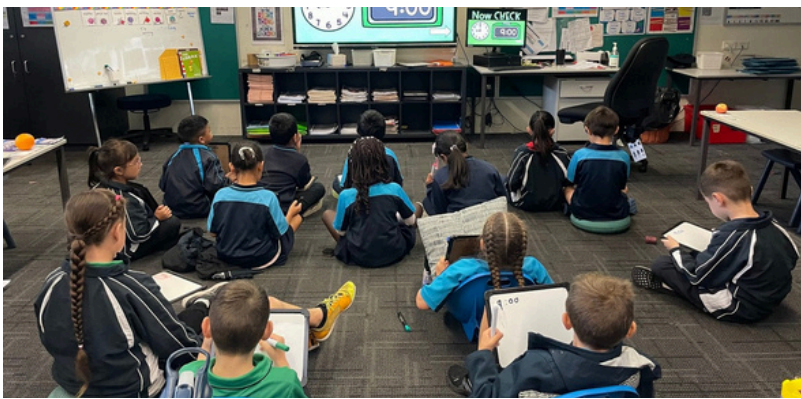

We have also been busy preparing for our upcoming assembly, which will be held on Tuesday, 19 May. We look forward to seeing you there if you are able to attend.



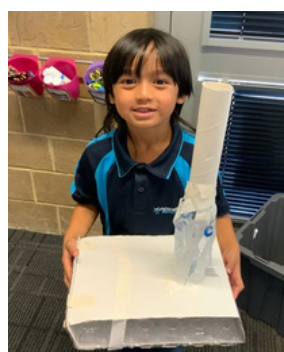
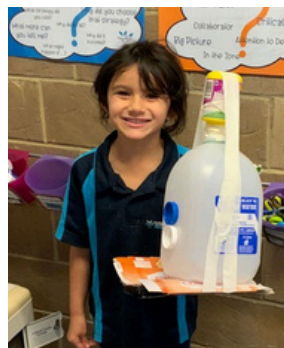
E3

They explored how celebrations and commemorations reflect Australian identity, values and traditions, and they examined their significance to different groups within the community.

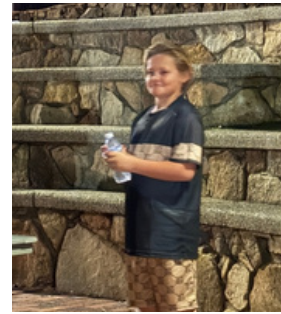

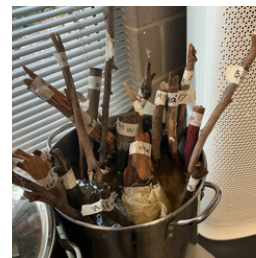


ART

The cloth was boiled for several hours and next week students will be unwrapping them to see what prints and colours have been made on their fabric. It was interesting to see what we could make with the nature we see around us everyday and also introduce a skill students can modify to be creative at home. 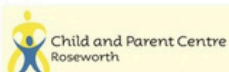
