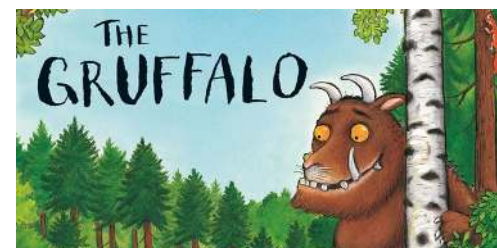
Kindy

P2

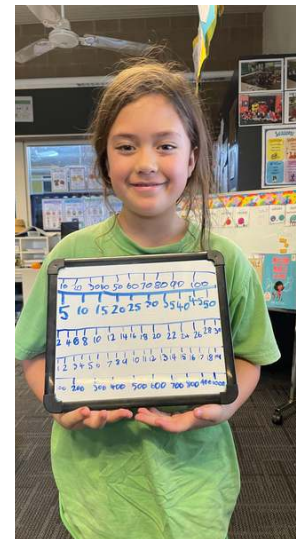
This term we reached 100 days of school for the year! In PP2 we celebrated with a day of fun and activities all about 100.

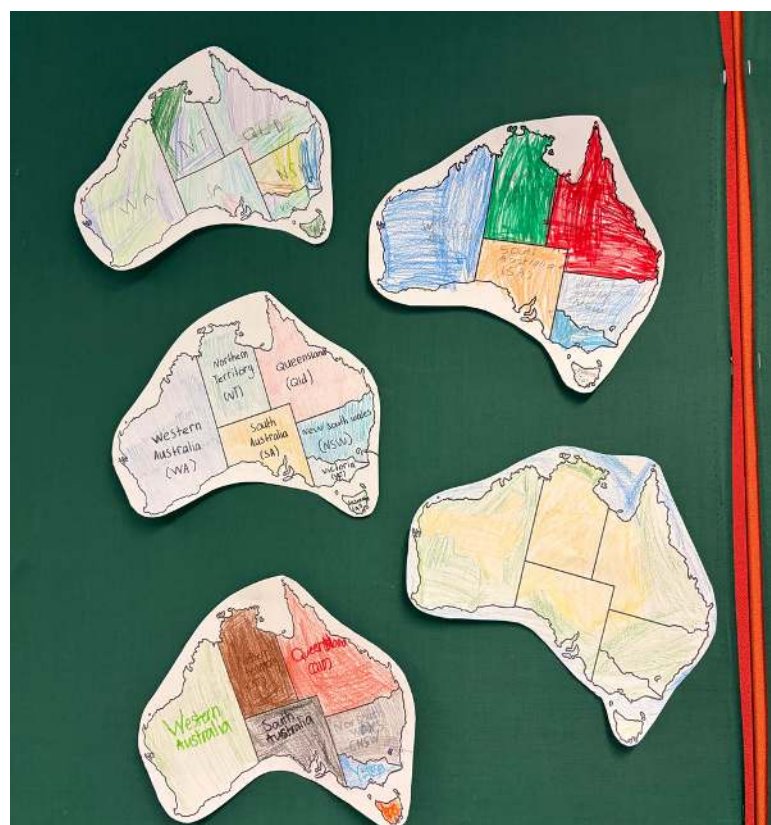
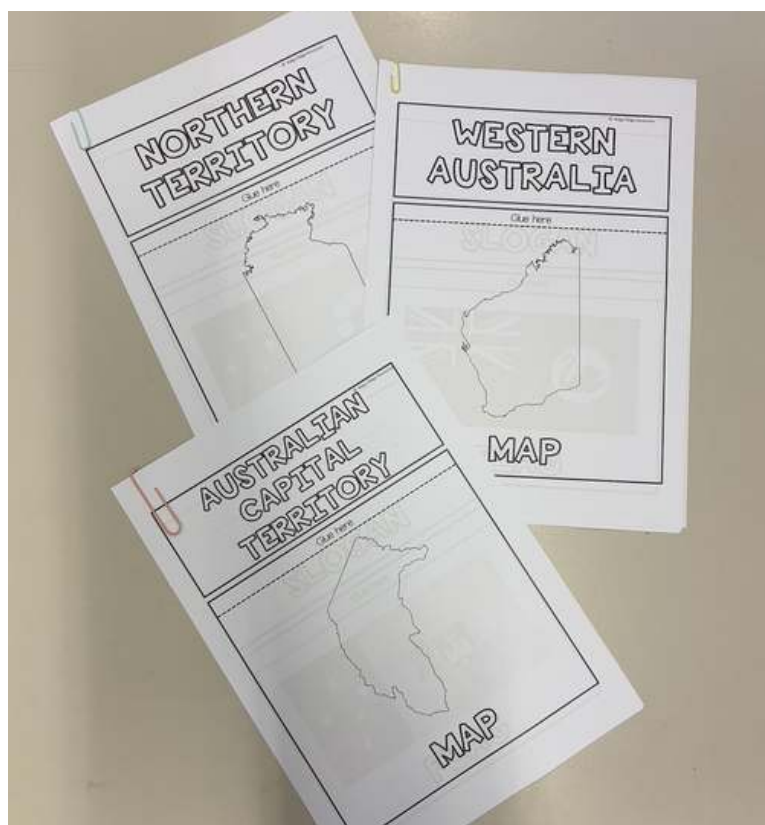
W1

Our students have been discovering that fashion is about much more than clothes.

As part of their learning about sustainability, they explored the amazing history of textile production with Mrs Foley, travelling from hand-woven baskets and bone needles used by early communities, through to metal needles, sewing machines and the computerised robotic arms used in fashion production today. Inspired by how people have always found creative ways to make and reuse materials, students are now becoming sustainable designers themselves. Using second-hand T-shirts destined for landfill, they will cut the fabric into strips and weave them on cardboard looms to create colourful, reusable bags.



It has been wonderful to see students combining history, creativity and environmental responsibility as they learn how small actions can make a big difference for our planet.
